





How New Zealand Invented Adventure Sports

New Zealander Henry van Asch was burning around the ski alones of Wanaka in the 1980s when another adventurous Kiwi persuaded him to try a strange new extreme sport. Harly yourself of a bridge, said his new pal, with just a thick rubber rope around your sake to stop you from plattering on the ground below. Fun! [...] Soon the pair was encouraging other brave buddies to take the planes. [...] Of course, the sport that Henry and his friend A.J. Hackett had accidentally invented was bungee jumping.

Their first commercial site — the first anywhere in the world — was Kawarau Bridge Bungy (yes, the spelling's different) on New Zealand's South Island and consists of a 140-foot drop from a steel-framed bridge over a rushing river. Twenty-eight people dove on opening day, November 12, 1988 [...].
