Some verbs ending in a single consonant + the second last letter is a vowel → double the last letter + ed	plan → plan ned stop → stop ped

Some, any and no

Some: algum (s), alguma (s), um pouco de.

Any: Nenhum (a), qualquer, algum (a)

No: nenhum (a)

- São usados com substantivos contáveis e incontáveis.

Some: algum (s), alguma (s), um pouco de.

- É usado em sentença afirmativas e interrogativas quando queremos pedir ou oferecer algo.
- Não é específico.

There are some vegetables in the fridge.

Would you like some tea?

Should

Could

Any: Nenhum (a), qualquer, algum (a)

- Usamos depois de formas negativas e em sentenças interrogativas com a exceção do SOME.
- É usado em afirmativas somente quando o significado for QUALQUER.

They can't (can+not) drink any soda.

Do you have any problem?

I want to eat any fruit.

No: nenhum (a)

-Usado em sentenças que parecem ser afirmativas porém com o NO inseridos tornam-se negativas.

I have **no** sugar at home.

She listens to **no** rock.

Complete com SOME, ANY, NO
