_____	Use it for years, months, seasons, centuries, etc. It is also used with periods of the day (morning, afternoon, evening). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I was born in 2005. • We'll take some photos in the afternoon.
at	Use it to indicate a point in time (hours, mainly). It's also used in the expression "at night" and for holidays. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I was born at 9 a.m. • We'll check out the photos at night.
_____	Use it for specific dates and days of the week. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I was born on July 1st. • We'll take some photos on Saturday.
